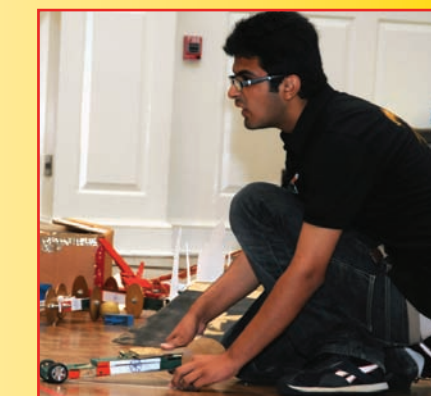

A theme that ran throughout the 2011 World Finals was family — more specifically — the friendly, unique, and sometimes crazy Odyssey of the Mind family.
