World Finals 2000 Opening Ceremonies — International Greetings, Universal Smiles

2000 World Finals Opening Ceremony — and it was

enough to make anyone happy. With a performance by a talented singing group, international greetings guaranteed to spread good cheer, and the extended applause of thousands of participants, the Ceremony set a tone of excitement and pleasant anticipation that continued over the next three days.

> In his opening speech, host Sammy Micklus said, "With the new millennium comes new changes for

the Odyssey of the Mind." One change is a new pledge, written by team members from Humboldt High in Potsdam, Germany, and adopted as the official anthem of the program.

Another change is a new Odyssey of the Mind song, which was

written and performed by the Lithuanian pop group, Smile. These five teenagers with amazing voices are members of the Klaipeda Technical Institute team (see insets). They were a big hit as they charmed the audience and moved everyone to clap and sway along with their catchy tune.

Special guest Adam Rusilowsky taught the audience to say "hello" in his native Polish. He then introduced representatives of all countries in attendance to come to the podium and give greetings in their own native language, beginning

wile became the theme of the Odyssey of the Mind with "G'Day" of Australia and ending with the 10-year-old representative from the Netherlands, who was lifted up to the podium to greet everyone in Dutch.

> Adam touched everyone with his demonstration of "smile hugs." He told the audience, "When you meet one another, exchange smile hugs." He said he would show them how and that they could laugh if they wanted. Wearing the widest grin possible, he panned the audience back and forth. As expected, the crowd roared, not just because they were laughing with Adam but because they felt the warmth he exuded through this universal gesture.

Back at the podium,

Sammy posed a welcome challenge: "The team who thinks they have the best coach in the world, please clap." The response was overwhelming. Several minutes of clapping turned into a standing ovation by thousands of cheering team members, all eager to express their gratitude to their coaches. Finally, Sammy told them, "You're all right." The ceremony was filled with



many magical moments, but when all was said and done, one stood out above the rest. When Dr. Sam Micklus, Odyssey of the Mind founder, delivered his traditional line, "Let the games begin," the crowd was ecstatic. Once again, smiles lit the room.

he Odyssey of the Mind 2000 World Finals was held May 31-June 3 on the campus of the University of Tennessee, Knoxville. Here are some reasons why this year's event was the best World Finals ever!

- More than 550 teams came from 42 U.S. states and 11 other countries to compete.
- The event was broadcast LIVE over the Internet in video AND audio (see back page).
- May 29-June 4 was declared Creativity Week in Knoxville by proclamation of Mayor Vince Ashe.
- We had 5 judges from Germany and 3 from Poland.

- Ronald McDonald House Charities was awarded the Odyssey of the Mind Creativity Award for its innovative methods of helping people in need.
- The first International Festival was held, where teams from different countries showcased items unique to their culture.
- William Cook, of Oklahoma, received the Odyssey of the Mind Spirit Award for his work with Creative Opportunities Unlimited and with our associations.
- Creative Opportunities Unlimited presented its first three scholarships for \$500 each.

Team: **New LOTHROP HS**, New Lothrop, MI

Elasti-Pumper, Div. II: *This team had* amazing design and construction of very detailed costumes and props. They created a vehicle with a concealed driver, human fruit and firebreathing dragon. It was a sophisticated solution by virtue of its simplicity and elegance.

Team: LONGMONT HS, Longmont, CO Pest-Aside, Div. III: This team's pest was a bug vehicle that walked through a maze of contraptions. Designed to operate without human intervention, it was able to trigger events by itself, then paused to let them occur, all while being transported to the next contraption. Though well-designed, its complexity brought great risk to the solution.

King Arthur, Div. I: An umbrella frame that opens to make Q-tip dragonflies fly. A huge dragon that roars with a blaze in his eve.

A puppet show and costume that made us take note.

An extraordinary team that gets our unanimous vote.

Team: CLASSEN SCH OF ADVANCED STUDIES & PERFORMING ARTS, Oklahoma City, OK

King Arthur, Div. II: Throughout its performance, this team demonstrated innovative use of materials and concepts within a silent movie theme enhanced by the use of black and white. Simplistic materials, such as baby wipes and dryer sheets, were highly effective, especially when taken into account the minimal cost overall. The team took significant risk in developing its solution.

Team: VOROSMARTY MILHALY GIMNAZIUM, Budapest, Hungary King Arthur, Div. II: This team used a single 4 x 6 piece of cloth to represent every prop the bodies of the teammates did not portray, including the sail of a human-created ship that brilliantly rocked in the wind, the cloak of a 12-foot monster, followed by the Round Table of the King's Court. They pinched the bottom and it became the Holy Grail that held Arthur's flowing blood. Then it flipped over to become the boulder. It also tented over team members with crossed swords to illustrate a chapel.

Team: **UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA**, Norman, OK

King Arthur, Div. IV: This team set their non-Arthur act in a parallel universe, using math to communicate ideas and created a costume that was a musical instrument played in battle. This team took a serious risk by creating a math-based solution to a performance problem.

Team: **PEI JAI LABORATORY SCH**, Shanghai, China

Shrinking Structure, Div. I: In every aspect of this team's performance, with movement and dance, they were able to communicate effectively nonverbally, which kept the audience spellbound. All movements were perfectly synchronized with accompanying music and sound.

Team: NORTHWEST G/T PROG A, Shickshinny, PA

Genie, Div. I: This team "wowed" the judges with its risk-taking interpretation of the problem. Although thier solution was not the most technically effective, their interpretation allowed them to succeed when expected to fail.

Team: CHENANGO VALLEY MID/HS, Binghamton, NY

Genie, Div. II: The team showed exceptional creativity by shrinking the audience along with their characters to pull us into a world where we never expected to be. Taking risks, they transformed the stage to the inside of a living room sofa, complete with commonly lost items.

Team: CORUNNA HS, COTUNNA, MI Spontaneous: The team created a skit where the narrator was a hybrid of Old McDonald, a seal, and a goat. The other members played barnyard animals. The horse's neigh and the cow chewing her cud made us feel as though we were actually in the barnyard. All aspects of the presentation fit within the dimensions of their story.

Team: HANAU HS, DoDDS, Germany Spontaneous: This team built a vehicle to solve its problem. During the final "timed" element, they were presented with a dilemma: how to get more points without losing those they already had. With quick thinking, they built an elevated extension on their vehicle, which knocked down pipes for score that were behind a doll blocking the way. Their extension was risk taking, because they had no idea if it would work.
