

An amazing "piano" track system played each individual key, making and breaking electrical contacts to light up each key automatically. The vehicle rotated a section of the track 180 degrees and flipped the track upside down so the vehicle could defeat the obstacles. The ability to combine engineering proficiency with artistic flair truly displayed the spirit of OotM.

The team designed a vehicle capable of effortlessly moving beneath a set a monkey bars. It leapt from bar to bar, releasing the bar behind with its arms, swinging beneath the track, and then catching the next bar with its feet. This team displayed a phenomenal amount of risk-taking and skill in getting a vehicle to move in a truly unique way.

International School of Geneva Geneva Switzerland

This team demonstrated a sophisticated level of engineering as complex sequences of events were used to solve several tasks. For example, a rubber band activated a pneumatic piston that pushed a lever that slowly rotated a platform to reverse the direction of a truck on a turn-table. The complexity and unique mechanisms this team developed, including sequences of multiple functions operating in tandem, embody risk-taking and creativity.

This team created an intricate membership sign, a Jurassic Presidential seal made entirely of rubber bands, dinosaur costumes that utilized pistachio shells, plastic spoons and every single part of a water bottles. What elevated this team was its representation of Pangea -aluminum disks spelled out "Pangea" but they stacked together to form a globe featuring the prehistoric continent. The disks were created by melting down over 500 aluminum cans in a homemade foundry the team built in one member's backyard.

Daemyung Middle School Seoul, Korea

The team brought STEM principles into the Classics problem by incorporating a math equation called the Golden Ratio. They created a multifaceted set that performed a balancing act and could be used for storage as well as transporting us to Marioland, the Egyptian Pyramids, and the Mona Lisa.

III Lo Gdvnid Gdvnia. Poland

This team displayed exceptional creativity and risk-taking in combining Zofia Olsztynska showed exceptional Spontaneous skill to use up the 2 min. of time left. She realized she was the last to respond and launched into improvisation. She continued and enhanced the story, staying in character even when all around her were in stitches. Her last response included song and dance and finished the story with flair —all in her second language.

Joshua showed great creativity and ingenuity in building a unique instrument to play the team's original score. Joshua meticulously built an organ using PVC pipes, keys made of wood, and paper flaps weighted with coins. He did not simply make an organ, which would have been highly creative, but invented a new type of woodwind instrument inspired by its operation that was both technically complex and outstandingly creative.
