dyssey of the Mind tournaments are all celebrations where else can you experience anything like them? World Finals is the ultimate worldwide celebration showing off the wonderful ideas from students around the world, but this year it will be extra special. This will be the 40th Odyssey of the Mind World Finals, which means there have been about 760 World Champions of creativity!

It has grown from a tournament with about 12 schools from across the US to the largest creative problem solving competition in the world. Almost 800 teams will compete over three funfilled days at Michigan State University. There will be teams from across the US and around 13 other countries. Canada, China, Germany, Hong Kong, India, Japan, Mexico, Poland, Qatar, Russia, Singapore, South Korea, Switzerland are just a few that make a regular appearance.

For almost 30 years Eurofest has provided a great opportunity for teams to show off OotM solutions and meet new people. This year it will be held April 25 – 30 in St. Petersburg, Russia, which is known as the cultural capital of Russia. This will be the 27th festival held.

It is an annual showcase of solutions by teams from across Europe and beyond. It is not a typical tournament, but a fun-filled festival where attendees showcase their longterm solutions, practice spontaneous and make new friends from around the world. It's a true celebra-

tion of camaraderie and creativity! Aside from the showcase, there will be a Mixed-Team Problem where teams from three different countries solve a special problem and present on the final day of the festival. Other fun activities include the International Fair and Cultural Festival.

Countries participating include Belarus, Germany, France, Switzerland, Poland, Moldova, Ukraine, Hungary, Czech Republic, Romania, Kazakhstan, China, India, Togo, USA, and more. If you want to participate visit the website for more information:

CHANGING THE FACE OF MEDICINE Dr. Mary Walker, 1832 – 1919

r. Mary Walker changed the face of medicine during the US Civil War.
She could not be deterred from opposing sides in her quest to save lives during the war, even when it would have been easier to give up. Walker was a surgeon, a POW and possibly a spy -- and out of the about 3,500 Medal of Honor recipients, she is the only woman to receive one. She kept this focus going throughout her life as she worked to advance women's rights in the medical field and beyond.

Walker was born in Oswego, New York in 1832. Her parents encouraged their five daughters to pursue an education, which was rare at the time. Walker embraced getting an education, and in 1855 graduated as a medical doctor from Syracuse Medical College. She was the second woman to graduate from this college.

She had her own private practice for a few years. When the American Civil War broke out in 1861, she wanted to join the army as a surgeon but wasn't allowed because of her gender. Because of her credentials, she didn't want to be a nurse, either, so she found other ways to help.

Walker worked for free at the temporary hospital set up at the U.S. Patent Office in Washington, D.C. She also organized the Women's Relief Organization to help the families of the wounded who came to visit them at local hospitals.

In 1862, Walker moved to Virginia, treating the wounded at field hospitals throughout the state. In 1863, her medical credentials were finally accepted by the Union Army and she was appointed as a War Department surgeon, becoming the first female surgeon in Army history. Walker was captured in April 1864 by the South and held as a prisoner of war for about four months. She and other doctors were eventually exchanged for Confederate medical officers. According to the National Library of Medicine, it was rumored that Walker had been captured intentionally so she could spy for the North, but there is little evidence to support that claim.

Not long after being released by the Confederates, Walker returned to medicine as an assigned medical director at a hospital for women prisoners and was awarded a Medal of Honor for her service by President Andrew Johnson. When standards for the Medal of Honor were revised in 1910, Walker's medal was one of 900 taken away. Her efforts as an army surgeon and time spent as a POW did not qualify for the award because she was a civilian. However, she refused to give the medal back and wore it for the rest of her life. In 1977, President Jimmy Carter restored the honor thanks to efforts made by her family.

Aside from her wartime efforts, Walker was also an outspoken advocate for women's rights. Not only did she fight to become a respected doctor and an army surgeon, but she also argued for the right to wear clothing that enabled better mobility. Walker chose to wear a modified uniform throughout the war. It was a dress-and-trouser combination that was very unpopular, but she wore it anyway. She eventually switched to men's clothes, even being arrested for impersonating a man. She argued that she was given special permission by the government to dress that way as part of her defense.

Through many different distractions Walker spent her life standing up for women's rights and saving lives—no matter what society argued was improper.

Odyssey Angels: The Final Step

he response to the Odyssey Angels program has grown even more as it enters its 6th year. Creative ideas have been explored, friendships forged, and many lives and neighborhoods improved. There were a lot of great ideas presented during this year's Odyssey Angel enrollment.

Groups from around the world are participating -- from Canada, India, Mexico, the U.S. and beyond. They are helping kids with disabilities, struggling families, building community gardens, and more. We consider everyone an angel that chose to enroll and help their community. One of the outstanding groups will be selected to attend World Finals. Here are the next steps to completing the Odyssey Angel program for this year.

If you have enrolled in the program by completing the online enrollment form, you will be sent a follow-up email that contains the "Progress Report" form for your group.

A representative can fill it out and return it any time before the April 1st deadline. You must return it by this time in order to be eligible to attend World Finals where you can present your proj-

ect. It simply asks you to update us on your project. We require a reference from the community member(s) you are helping. Keep in mind that your project can be ongoing. You don't have to stop because of the deadline.

Also, remember that you do not have to fill out the form as soon as you receive it. You should send it when you feel it is the best time to have your work evaluated, as long as it is submitted before April 1st.

Then, the Odyssey Angels panel will have the difficult task of selecting just one group to attend World Finals to represent the Angels. This group will by notified by Odyssey Angels Director Cheryl Micklus and the results will be posted to the Odyssey Angels web site.

There are so many generous and creative entries! Although only one group can present at World Finals, many communities around the world benefit — they are the true winners!

Again, we thank the groups for their hard work and look forward to reading about all the good that has been done in those progress reports!

Last year's winning Odyssey Angels team was Big Cypress Elementary from Naples, FL. This group helped to provide comfort to the local homeless community by creating and giving away sleeping mats. They used many Odyssey skills -creative problem-solving, repurposing trash items, independent study, improving an existing idea, teamwork, and much more --- to help the homeless population. The team learned how to make "plarn"—strips of plastic bags that are weaved together to create the mats. Each mat uses over 500 plastic bags that might otherwise be discarded. They also trained other groups to help spread their project throughout the community and beyond!
